

WHEREAS, such methods have been approved by the Erie County Department of Public Works, and

WHEREAS, in the past, all costs of manpower, equipment, and materials have been calculated to the satisfaction of all parties, and

WHEREAS, a new contract between the Towns and Erie County is currently being negotiated, and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2013, there was a tentative agreement between the towns and Erie County which included a 3 year term with an annual increase of 5.0% as was past practice, and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2013, Erie County made a counter proposal to increase the contract from 3 years to 5 years and to reduce the monetary increase of 0.5%, and

Lancaster Town Board:

Our cemetery, located on Genesee Street in Bowmansville has been in operation for over 150 years, and has managed to be self-supporting for those years. Of late, like most small cemeteries, we have experienced financial difficulties. In 2012 our receipts were \$3752.06 while disbursements totaled \$3809.26, resulting in a deficit of \$57.20. The four of us on our Board receive no compensation, of course, and are genuinely dedicated to maintaining our operation without having to surrender it to the Town Board.

On August 9, 2013, Cynthia Craig, investigator for the State Department of Cemeteries, met with us at the cemetery. She saw the very tall spruce tree in the western section, noticed how the roots are tipping one large monument in particular, and realizing the danger and potential liability should the stone topple and injure someone, told us that the tree really must be removed. This is the only tree in the cemetery and was there long before we instituted our present rule of not allowing the planting of any trees.

We really cannot afford to remove this tree, so we are asking you, the Town Board, to remove it.
