

I am requesting that the Town of Lancaster continue to participate in the collaborative effort with the Lancaster Central School District providing a Program Coordinator for the Family Support Center from September 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

The Lancaster Central School District has asked the Town of Lancaster to provide 50% of the cost of the health insurance and the direct salary of the Program Coordinator of the Family Support Center. The Town of Lancaster is being asked to pay \$8,880.24 (50% of total Health Insurance costs of \$17,760.48) in addition to the salary cost of \$23,907.00 (50% of total salary of \$47,814.00) for a total of \$32,787.24 in two installments of \$6,557.45 on or about October 1, 2013, December 1, 2013, and two installments of \$9,836.17 on February 1, 2014 and April 1, 2014.



I am requesting that the Town of Lancaster continue to participate in the collaborative effort with the Lancaster Central School District providing a Joint Social Work Counselor Program from the period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

The funding for the program includes \$52,285.00 for direct salary and \$36,275.00 for contractual expenses and fringe benefits, for a total annual cost of approximately \$88,560.00, with approx. \$1,034.00 being provided from the New York State Office of Children and Family Services, and \$43,763.00 being provided from the Town of Lancaster and \$43,763.00 from the Lancaster Central School District. The Lancaster School District will reimburse the Town of Lancaster for their share of program expenses in two installments of \$10,940.75 on or about October 1, 2013, December 1, 2013, and two installments of \$10,940.75 on February 1, 2014 and April 1, 2014.



I am writing to express my enthusiastic support for the Lancaster Airport. I am not an observer from afar. I live on Ransom Road, walking distance from the East end of the landing field. Planes fly over my house often but I fail to see how they are considered a nuisance. The nearby trains are more frequent and make far more noise. As for safety issues - I can count on one hand the number of aircraft incidents in the Buffalo area in my lifetime and I am 83 years old. I recall when Buffalo Airport was three quonset Huts, A, B & C in the middle of a field with a windsock for guidance.

I am weary of people who choose a house to call home and then complain about the Race Bridge the Race track, gravel pits, Railroads, coke plants, traffic and commercial development. These are not covert operations which suddenly appeared. They are there for all to see. 50 years ago Walden Ave was extended from Harlow Rd to town line bringing valuable growth and revenue to Lancaster. The airport is an important part of this industrial corridor. Attempts to strangle progress cannot be tolerated by bending to petty, unfounded complaints. We must support expansion or suffer the consequences when industries no longer consider Lancaster a place to succeed.

**Resolution Regarding Erie County Snow Plowing and Ice Control**

A motion was made by Councilman Aronica, seconded by Councilman Roesch to adopt the following resolution regarding Erie County Snow Plowing and Ice Control:

**WHEREAS**, The Town of Grand Island, recognizes that plowing and de-icing town, as well as county roads, is in the best interest and safety of its residents, and

**WHEREAS**, historically Erie County and the 25 Towns within the county have negotiated contracts which assure that the majority of the county roads within the towns would be maintained according to the same snow and ice control methods used on all town roads, and

**WHEREAS**, such methods have been approved by the Erie County Department of Public Works, and

**WHEREAS**, in the past, all costs of manpower, equipment and materials have been calculated to the satisfaction of all parties, and

**WHEREAS**, any issues that have arisen during snow and ice control in previous years have been resolved by all parties involved, and

**WHEREAS**, a new contract between Towns and Erie County is currently being negotiated, and

**WHEREAS**, on March 20, 2013 there was a tentative agreement between the Town and Erie County which included a 3 year term with an annual increase of 5.0% as was past practice, and

**WHEREAS**, this agreement was considered fair and within the budgeting confines of Erie County, and

**WHEREAS**, on April 16, 2013, Erie County made a counter proposal to increase the contract from 3 to 5 years and to reduce the monetary increase to 0.5%, and

**WHEREAS**, the County proposed rate is one Towns cannot afford, and

**WHEREAS** the budgetary planning for 2014 is going to be starting in many municipalities, and

**WHEREAS**, the deadline for Towns to order road salt de-icer is now past,  
**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town of Grand Island calls on the Erie County Executive and the Erie County Legislature to help resolve the issue between the Erie County Department of Public Works and the 25 Towns within the County of Erie with regards to snow removal and de-icing of County roads within the Towns that is fair and equitable to all parties, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Town Clerk of the Town Of Grand Island is to transmit copies of the resolution to the Erie County Executive Mark Polancarz, Erie County Legislator Kevin Hardwick, Erie County Chairwoman Betty Jean Grant, and Erie County Department of Public Works Commissioner John Loffredo, and the other 24 towns within Erie County.



Subject: 2014 Budget Request for the Town Library



After discussing library building needs with Terry McCracken, Terry has recommended that I submit the following budget request for 2014.

1. Contractual Expenses - .411, The yearly contract with Otis elevator was \$2,494.00 in 2013. The contract with Fire Safety Systems was \$400.00 in 2013. The cost for 2014 would be \$2,894.00.
2. Repairs and Maintenance - .426, The roof of the building has been leaking for years. Roofers have slowed the leaks but not stopped them. Additional work is needed to stop the leaks. \$2,000.00 should be sufficient.

Ice breakers on the south and east sides of the roof have been damaged and should be reinstalled. The cost is approximately \$7,000.00.

The floor drains in the public bathrooms are dry. The floor in the men's room is deteriorating and becoming a hazard. The approximate cost is \$5,000.00.

The book drop on the lower level was never enclosed. This causes a potential fire hazard. The approximate cost is \$1,000.00.

The fire alarm system needs replacement. This is the original system installed in 1975. Replacement parts are no longer available to repair the system. The bid to replace the system is \$3,480.00.


The outside concrete stairs have crumbling concrete and metal lips that are popping up and creating a safety hazard. They need to be repaired. The approximate cost is \$7,500.00.


\$3,000.00 is being requested for any unforeseen maintenance problems in 2013.

The total cost for .426 is \$28,980.00.

3. Landscaping Materials - .434 - \$500.00 is requested for flowers and plants to make the property attractive.

The total budget request for 2013 is \$32,374.00





Dear Supervisor Fudoli,

Let me start by thanking you for the time you and the Town Board afforded Christine Scott and me during your work session of August 19<sup>th</sup> to explain some of our needs at the Lancaster Rural Cemetery. We certainly hope that an agreement can be worked out to enable the Town to provide some services to the cemetery as the law allows and as the need arises.

You may recall I stated at that meeting the cemetery was able to see a \$3000 income over expenses last year. While we feel we are on the right track to bring financial stability to the association, we have a long way to go. But without the Town's annual appropriation of \$10,000 we would have been \$7000 in the deficit column, therefore your continued financial support of \$10,000 during 2014 is needed.

The board of the cemetery continues to carefully monitor our expenses, but at the same realize we need to spend money to offer the services which the community expects. We have tentative plans to have our garage roof replaced by the local roofers' union at no cost to us but

for materials. A new sign will also be replacing the one on Cemetery Road which is beyond repair. And as you well know, wages and daily expenses such as fuel costs continue to rise. We are planning to ask the NYS Division of Cemeteries for a rate increase, but we are limited in the amount to request which does not cover the increase in costs.

We also have recently had Section S resurveyed to allow for upright monuments. Society over recent years has changed and now prefers this type of monument over flat markers. This section is very attractive with a pond and wooded area and it is expected this will bring added sales for us.

We continue to receive compliments from the public as to how well the cemetery looks, "The best it has looked in years!" We will to continue to work hard for the community and for those who support us; but without your support and the support of the residents of Lancaster we will not be able to provide that service.

Dear Mr. Kaminski:

My wife and I moved to the town of Lancaster, NY in July 2012. Since this time, we have become concerned with the level of traffic at the intersection of Transit Road and Michael Anthony Lane. We have come to find that many of our neighbors also share this concern.

Michael Anthony Lane is a no outlet street, meaning the only entry and exit is via Transit Road. Because of the high level of traffic, taking turns, especially left turns, onto Transit Road can be not only time consuming, but dangerous. In addition to the regular traffic patterns, the added traffic in and out of the Tim Horton's restaurant located on the south corner of this intersection also provides complications, especially as cars turn northbound and accelerate straight through the intersection. This means any openings in the northbound traffic flow are often taken first by exiting Tim Horton's patrons, increasing the level of difficulty and overall level of possible danger for those turning out of Michael Anthony Lane.

I am formally requesting the installation of a traffic light with a left-turn signal (for southbound travelers turning into Michael Anthony Lane) at this intersection, to allow for more convenient and safer turning in and out of Michael Anthony Lane.

I spoke with the office of the Lancaster Town Supervisor, which informed me that Transit Road is owned and maintained by the NYS DOT. The Town Supervisor's office also informed me that multiple traffic studies have been done in the past that have shown there is no need for a traffic signal at this intersection. However, I ask that this please be reconsidered, despite conclusions of any prior traffic studies.

Most other residential roads that intersect with Transit in the same general area (e.g., Madeira Dr, Strasmer Rd, Zubrick Rd, Cayuga Blvd), either have a traffic light of their own and/or have other entry/exit points. Michael Anthony is without such options.

There are over 60 homes on Michael Anthony Lane that have no exits other than via Transit Road. There are numerous families with young and adolescent children, both passengers and inexperienced drivers, who I feel are especially at risk when exiting at this intersection.


I believe a traffic light would significantly reduce this risk by allowing a safe break in traffic for a driver to complete a turn without having to cross at least three lanes of traffic to turn left, or to have to rapidly accelerate to turn right. Due to the relatively low traffic from/into Michael Anthony Lane, there would

be minimal disruption to Transit Road traffic flow, especially if a sensor was used to detect traffic attempting to exit/enter Michael Anthony Lane.

For these reasons, I ask you to please reconsider installing a traffic-light, with southbound left-turn signal, at the intersection of Transit Road and Michael Anthony Lane, not just as a convenience factor for residents of Michael Anthony Lane, but as a factor of safety to prevent an avoidable and potentially fatal accident.

Any expansion of Airport operations or any additional improvements at the Airport are prohibited without the prior written approval of the Town Board of the Town of Lancaster. Any request by the Airport for such written approval shall be treated as a modification to the special use permit and shall be subject to the requirements of Section 50-46 of the Town of Lancaster Zoning Law including the requirement of a public hearing.

We have recently accepted ownership of Juniper Boulevard between Seneca Street and Walden Avenue. After driving this section of road at nighttime, I believe it would be in the best interest of public safety that the Town Board pursue installing street lights along this section of road. After reviewing the site plan there are no street lights scheduled to be placed on Juniper Boulevard when the development is built out.
