

Dear Supervisor Fudoli:

Assemblyman Dennis Gabryszak has asked the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) to respond to your September 20, 2013 letter regarding the installation of generator transfer switches on State-owned traffic signals, in the Town of Lancaster.

The NYSDOT does consider the Town's desire to have all signals equipped with generator transfer switches as a worthwhile endeavor. However, our traffic signal maintenance forces are fully engaged in maintaining our existing signal system and we cannot divert the amount of staff resources required for the installation of these transfer switches. It is for this reason that we have allocated a portion of our limited signal contract monies for this purpose. Due to competing priorities and limited resources, this is not always a timely process.

In an effort to work cooperatively with the Town, and based on a priority listing provided by the Town, the NYSDOT has committed to installing the generator transfer switches for the signals located at the intersections of Broadway and Bowen Road, Broadway and Townline Road, and Genesee Street and Harris Hill Road as priority locations. We anticipate the installations will be completed in approximately three months. The remainder will be installed as part of a future contract to be let for bid next year.



You provided them with a forum that discussed the importance of first line supervision and helped set the tone of instruction for the entire three week course.


