
Dear Supervisor Fudoli and Honorable Council Members:


After reviewing the above referenced project, the Town's Forestry Department offers a negative opinion on this project for the following reasons:


1. The berm along Genesee Street is not wide enough to sustain the species of tree proposed to go there. Also, I would not consider trees on 30 ft. centers a buffer.
2. The trees on the west side of the project should be extended to the entire width of the property.
3. There are no indications on this plan about what areas are to be seeded and no indications or specifications on what varieties and rates of seeding are to be done.

Dear Supervisor Fudoli,

I want to thank you for your part in making the below law in regard to storing refuse in "a close-fitting cover at all times", as stated below:

New Local Laws related to Refuse and Recycling were adopted by the Town Board on January 20, 2015. Important changes are as follows: Every owner and/or occupant of any residential property located within the Town of Lancaster's Refuse District shall be responsible for storing all refuse in a leak-proof container with a close-fitting cover at all times until removed from the premises at disposal. Such container, including contents, shall not exceed sixty (60) pounds in weight.

You may recall that my wife and I attended a number of Town Board meetings in 2013 expressing our concern about the rat problem on Riemers Avenue in Lancaster. I want to make you aware that there continues to be a rat problem on our street. On August 14, 2015 I went to take a swim in my in-ground pool but I was prevented from doing so. To my disgust, there was a dead, drowned rat at the bottom of my pool. I have enclosed a photo. No doubt if you found a rat at the bottom of your pool you would feel equally disgusted.

The vast majority of residents on Riemers Avenue do properly cover their garbage, however, there are still a few property owners that continue to put their garbage out in ONLY a garbage bag or in an uncovered container. I have personally seen rats crawling on uncovered garbage. Unfortunately, a few property owners choosing not to properly store their garbage can negatively impact other residents by contributing to the rat problem in Lancaster. As you know, research shows that proper garbage storage is an effective way to diminish the rat problem in towns like Lancaster. I would like to be able to enjoy my backyard and pool without having to worry about rats, as I'm sure you would also want as a property owner.

I am asking that you please **enforce** the above law adopted on January 20, 2015. I understand that you have limited human resources, however, anything you could do to enforce this law would be greatly appreciated.

At your earliest convenience, I would appreciate it if you would contact me letting me know what steps will be taken to ensure that garbage is being properly stored, as indicated in the town code.

Police arrest four involved in robbery, kidnapping

On Thursday, Aug. 13, the Lancaster Police arrested four subjects who were involved in a robbery and kidnapping incident that began overnight at a Freeman Drive motel. Officers originally responded to a convenience store at Genesee Street and Transit Road where a male victim had called to report a robbery.

The victim told police that he had been confronted by a female and male with a gun inside a guest room at the motel, where he was robbed of cash. The subjects later forced the victim into a car at gunpoint. He was driven to the convenience store, where he was told to go inside and get

additional money from the store's ATM.

The victim was able to lock himself inside the store's restroom and contact police. Depew and Cheektowaga Police located the subjects' vehicle in the lot of a nearby supermarket on Transit Road, where the subjects were taken into custody. Lancaster Police detectives responded and obtained search warrants for the guest room where the initial incident occurred and also for several vehicles involved.

Arrested and charged in relation to this incident were a 43-year-old male and 37, 28 and 20-year-old females. All of the defen-

dants were from Rochester, N.Y. Charges against the subjects include: Kidnapping, 2nd Degree (Class B Felony), Robbery 2nd Degree (Class C Felony), Grand Larceny 4th Degree (Class E Felony), Criminal Possession of Stolen Property (Class E Felony), Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance with Intent to Sell (Class D Felony) and Menacing 2nd Degree (Class A Misdemeanor).

All of the defendants were arraigned in Lancaster Town Court and remanded to the Erie County Holding Center to await further proceedings.


