WHEREAS, Town of Lancaster’s Supervisor, Ronald Ruffino, Sr., desires to obtain new Public Administration Software and Related Services for use by all Town Offices, and

WHEREAS, the above-referenced service is available from Tyler Technologies through their national contract (# 090320-TTI) with Sourcewell (a local government and procurement collaborative of the State of Minnesota) of which the Town of Lancaster will be “Piggybacking” off of which eliminates the need for competitive bidding pursuant to §103 (16) of General Municipal Law, and

WHEREAS, the initial term of this agreement is five (5) years beginning March 1, 2021 and terminating February 28, 2026 with automatic annual renewal thereafter unless written notice is provided by either party sixty (60) days prior to the end of the then-current term, and

WHEREAS, the cost for the Public Administration Software and Related Services through Tyler Technologies is \$111,676.00/yr. for three (3) years with an initial one-time fee of \$25,036.00 and which will be paid for with funds in the Town’s 2021 Appropriated Fund Balance Account (Line Item 1.1.599).

**NOW, THEREFORE,

WHEREAS, Niagara Lutheran Health System, Inc. (“Niagara Lutheran”) has filed a Petition seeking assessment adjustments in real property located at 5959 Broadway, Lancaster, New York and identified as SBL # 116.02-2-2.11, a portion of which is subject to taxes levied by the Town of Lancaster (“Town”), County of Erie and the Lancaster Central School District, and

WHEREAS, the subject property consists of two buildings, one fully occupied by Niagara Lutheran Health System, Inc. for its corporate administrative functions and the other building occupied as a fitness center and a portion leased to a tenant to operate a childcare facility, and

WHEREAS, the entire property is presently treated as tax exempt on the Town’s 2020 assessment roll in accordance with the provisions of New York Real Property Tax Law § 420-a, and

WHEREAS, in resolution of the assessment challenge, the parties have proposed that Niagara Lutheran will make payment in lieu of taxes in a PILOT Agreement based upon \$1,112,075.00 of a total \$6,060,000.00 2020 assessment of the property being treated as taxable property.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Town and Niagara Lutheran agree and approve the terms of settlement set forth in the attached PILOT Agreement which provides that commencing with the Town’s 2020 assessment roll and effective for the subsequent years and continuing through the Town’s 2031 assessment roll and effective for the 2030/31 tax year, the Petitioner, Niagara Lutheran, will make payments in lieu of taxes on the property as defined in Schedule A of the PILOT Agreement based upon \$1,112,075.00 with a balance of \$2,060,000.00 2020 assessment of the property being treated as taxable property, and

BE IT FURTHER,

RESOLVED, that the Town will maintain the total assessment of the property on the tax-exempt portion of the Town’s assessment rolls through the term of this PILOT Agreement which will expire on December 31, 2031, and
